The NAME OF COMPETITION will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

<u>SERIES INFORMATION:</u> If this competition has been approved by U.S. Figure Skating as part of a series (National Solo Dance, Icemen, Excel etc.), use this space to insert that information.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Suggested language (modify as appropriate):

Test level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline, in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

Age restrictions/requirements: Singles free skate events (Well Balanced Program) have the following requirements.

Juvenile: Girls – 12 years of age or younger; Boys – 13 years of age or younger Open Juvenile: Girls – 13 years of age or older; Boys – 14 years of age or older Intermediate must be under the age of 18 Adults must be 21 years of age or older

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age, should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

ENTRIES: Modify as appropriate: Method of entries (i.e. EMS or other online tool), entry deadline, entry fees (per event, additional events, combined events, per skater/team), late fees;

REFUND POLICY: Suggested language, modify as appropriate: Entry fees will not be refunded after entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a enter \$ fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.



SCHEDULE: Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time for the announced dates of the competition. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available by phone, email or mail, web.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at enter name of rink, address, telephone number and website if applicable. Enter size of rink and any other pertinent information such as number of locker rooms, temperature of rink (especially if very cold), snack bars/restaurants, etc.

MUSIC: Enter how the competitors are to supply music (CDs [no CD-RWs], MP3s, music upload systems, etc.) The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the enter club name cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

<u>LIABILITY:</u> U.S. Figure Skating, (host club), and (name of arena) accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

<u>JUDGING SYSTEM:</u> Select and modify as appropriate to your event. Suggested language for competitions using IJS for standard competitive events:

REGISTRATION: Registration will begin on enter day, date and time and end at enter day and time. Suggested language: registration will be open one to two hours before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located enter place (lobby of the rink, hotel, outside). Please register promptly upon arrival.

PRACTICE ICE: There are no rules for practice ice and it is not mandatory to offer. However, it is a courtesy and most skaters, coaches and parents have come to expect it. It is also good revenue stream for the club. Discuss this offering with your club and referee. If offered, please be concise in the announcement how it will be handled (i.e. pre-orders, walk-ons, music versus no music and of course the cost per session).

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained enter location.

Recommended language: It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

<u>TEST CREDIT:</u> Suggested language: Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms at registration. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition. (Please consider including information such as when requests for test credit must be made [check with your chief accountant] as well as any fee you might be charging for the test credit packet).

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL COACHES:

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the following requirements:

Coaching U.S. Figure Skating athletes:

- Current member in good standing with U.S. Figure Skating
- Completed background check (green light status)
- Completed SafeSport Training*
- Continuing Education Requirements (CERs) for the 2018-19 Competition Season
- Proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

Coaching Compete USA athletes:

- Learn to Skate USA Instructor membership OR U.S. Figure Skating full membership
- Completed SafeSport Training* (for coaches 18 years old and over)
- Completed background check (green light status) (for coaches 18 years old and over)
- Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed (for coaches under 18 years old)

*SafeSport training is available through www.usfsaonline.org for full members of U.S. Figure Skating (through Learn to Skate USA portal for instructors). There is no cost to this training and certification is valid for 2 seasons

The LOC will have a list of compliant coaches who are approved to receive a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be <u>no exceptions</u> to this policy.

If a foreign coach has only foreign athletes at your competition, a background check and SafeSport Training is not required. Instead, the coach must submit a letter from their Federation stating they are a member in good standing.
